The website contains all kinds of important information about FCE. It has lots of various web pages with a lot of various forms and instructions dealing with FCE and ACWW at all levels.

This website is a tool that can be used by all FCE Members and "Friends of FCE." When was the last time that you needed that "certain form" or that "certain information" and your leaders did not have it. Did you check on the website for it?

Forms, Programs, and Recognition** – A place to find almost every form that you might need. It also includes information on various programs and methods of recognition of members. 8. Bylaws – Here you can read, download, or print the Bylaws of National FCE. 9. fceToday and FLASH Newsletters – A list of all current National FCE Newsletters. 10. Contact Info National, Alumni, and State – Here you will find all the contact information for National, State and Alumni officers. 11. Website Links – Tabs for links to other websites relating to FCE. 12. Contact Us - A form where members and nonmembers can contact National FCE. 13. Conference Award Winners - Find and view Conference Award winners from the present and past. 14. History of National FCE – This is a place to find the basic history of National FCE. It includes all of the past National Conferences and past National Presidents. 15. National Conference Info and Pictures – Find information about the current National Conference and Conferences from the past. Also view and download pictures from past National Conferences. 16. Alumni Officers, Forms, Newsletters – Here you will find all of the contact information for Alumni officers, various Alumni forms (including the Alumni Conference Scholarship Application) and the Alumni Newsletters. 17. Associated **Country Women of the World** – Here you will find all kinds of information about ACWW.

18. Legacy Fund Donations and Forms – This page describes what the Legacy Fund is and the Forms used to donate to it. **19.** Incorporation, Copyrights, Trademarks – This page explains all of the various Incorporation, Copyright and Trademarks and how they are used and enforced. **20.** State FCE Newsletters – Contains several of the various State FCE Newsletters that have been submitted. **21.** State Projects – Contains various information and pictures from States that

submitted them. **22. State Lesson Sharing** — Contains lessons that have been shared from various States. **23. Members Page** — Contains all Hearth Fire lessons, all FCE lessons, Character Counts Pillar Books and other miscellaneous FCE forms. All are in a form that can be read, printed, or downloaded. National FCE Fundraisers and Financial Helps

With the decrease in membership across the nation, National FCE is in need of your help through donations and fundraising activities. National FCE dues are no longer sufficient to pay all the financial responsibilities of the organization.

The biggest expense of National FCE is the Liability insurance, which is used at all levels of FCE, has increased every year and is a major part of the expenses each year. That along with other continuing rising costs, National needs additional help from their members. Currently, National FCE is not looking at raising dues.

What is National FCE doing to reduce expenses? The National FCE organization is doing all that they can do to reduce expenses. Some of these methods are:

- A website that has been set up and maintained by a volunteer Webmaster. This is saving over \$2,000 a year.
- All Board Members are paying the full National FCE Conference registration fee.
- All Board Members are paying their travel expenses.
- National FCE Headquarters hours and labor have been dropped substantially to save cost.
- Rather than holding a Fall Board Meeting in Kentucky, they are conducting business through emails, phone calls and monthly meetings via Zoom. This is saving National FCE thousands of dollars each year.
- Other things to reduce National FCE expenses are being done such as reducing printing etc.

Every FCE member, or "Friend of FCE" can help in many ways. One of the best ways is for each member to find, invite, and recruit new members. FCE members, and "Friends of FCE" can help through various donations and fundraisers. All financial donations to FCE are tax deductible because National FCE is a 501(c) 3 organization. Forms and additional information can be found on the National FCE website www.nafce.org.

Below are 6 methods that FCE Members, or "Friends of FCE" can use to make donations or give financial help.

1. Direct Donations

FCE members, and "Friends of FCE" can make donations directly to National FCE. Checks can be sent to National FCE Headquarters or to the current National FCE Treasurer.

2. Legacy Fund Donations

Financial donations can be made to the Legacy Fund. The money is invested in an Investment Fund. The Investment money cannot be used for FCE expenses. Only the Dividends of the Invested money can be used to help with FCE expenses.

3. Keeper's Corner Fundraising Booths

These booths are located in Klamath Falls, Oregon at Keeper's Corner LLC – Antique, Craft, and Collectible Mall. Check out their Facebook page. Booths are 100% donated and there is no consignment fees charged. 100% of the money raised is sent to National FCE. Donations of items are provided by FCE members, "Friends of FCE", vendors within the store, and other various donors. Check the FCE website for information on how to send your donated items. The booths are currently raising about \$250.00/month.

4. Dimes for Donation

National FCE needs your help through your donations. One way is collecting "A Dime at a Time". Please collect your extra dimes from your change, meetings, and all the activities you may attend. Collect the dimes in an empty water bottle, turn them in to your bank, and send the donation money to National FCE Headquarters.

5. Donation to National FCE Alumni Scholarship Fund

Each year, the National FCE Alumni offers up to 3 Conference Scholarships which pay for the cost of the National FCE Conference registration. Money for this scholarship is donated by National FCE Officer Alumni and other various donations. Donations are always welcome.

6. Honor Fund Donations

National FCE is accepting gifts in "Honor" or "In Memory" of members, relatives, or friends. Gifts will be used toward leadership education. All gifts will be acknowledged by National FCE. A list of honorees and donors will be listed on the website, or FLASH; however, the amount of the gift will not be disclosed.

Please consider helping in whatever method works best for you. Every penny, nickel, dime, quarter, or dollar helps.



Oregon FCE Zoom Lessons


Due to the COVID-19 epidemic and Oregon FCE Groups from across the state of Oregon, not being able to meet in person, Scott Teeples suggested, and it was decided, by the Oregon FCE Board that we would start holding a monthly Oregon FCE Zoom lesson starting in January 2021. Scott Teeples would host the lessons, via Zoom, and various people would present the lessons.

Scott set forth the task of inviting Oregon FCE members and some others from other states that he knew from serving on the National FCE Board. It did not take a long time and other FCE members from across the USA wanted to attend and present the lessons. Soon, Scott was emailing out over 500 invitations.

Meetings are held every month and are still continuing onward this year. April 5, 2023, was the 28th monthly lesson. They are usually held on the first Wednesday of the month at 10:00 AM Pacific Time (Oregon Time). FCE members, and "Friends of FCE" have participated from all across the USA. There have been "Guest Presenters" from Oregon, Virginia, West Virginia, Hawaii, Kansas, Florida, Maryland, Tennessee, Nebraska, and Mississippi. Most Presenters have been FCE members, but some have "Friends of FCE."

All of the Zoom Lessons have been recorded and are available on the Oregon website https://www.oregon-fce.org/oregon-fce-zoom-lessons-on-youtube.

Presenters are always needed. If you, or someone you know, would be willing to teach one of these lessons, please let Scott know if you'd be interested in being a presenter. Presenters can pretty much choose what they want to teach and use whatever method they want to use on Zoom. You don't need to be an expert presenter... we're all amateurs trying to do the best we can.
