Our National Focus remains on all aspects of Human Trafficking and Zero Hunger is being added. There will be more information at the 2019 Conference regarding the direction that we can go with the Zero Hunger.

What **excitement was in the air** when we received notice at Headquarters that a new club had been formed in Missouri. They have 5 members and who ever helped start this club should remember to fill out the form to receive their FCE Star Pin for signing up a new member. This form can be found on our website under the form's category plus it is included with this newsletter.

#### **HOTEL REGISTRATION**

All conference attendees must make their own room reservations. These reservations must be made by June 14, 2019 after that date attendees will be able to book rooms at the group room rate, but it will be subject to availability.

There is a link on our website to make your hotel reservations or you can contact them at 1-314-423-9700 and ask for our group name "National Association Family and Community Education" to get the group room rate of \$110.00 which is good from 7/14/19 to 7/22/19.

There is complimentary airport shuttle and if driving there will complimentary parking.

#### **Hotel Shuttle Information**

If you are arriving in Terminal 1, proceed to lower level baggage claim area and then to Exit 18. If you are arriving in Terminal 2, proceed to lower level baggage claim area and then to Exit 15. Hotel shuttles run every 20 minutes starting at the top of each hour continuously.

There will be 2 (\$10.00) discounted breakfast vouchers included with each room. Also, the rooms should have mini fridges.

#### **HEART OF FCE**

Congratulations to each state winner in the 2018 Heart of FCE. Four of the state winners were at the National FCE Conference in Austin, Texas this past July. Their state president pinned them as the bio was read by the national board member. They each were presented a yellow rose prior to having a group photo taken.

What an honor to be nominated for this award! It all starts when a club chooses a nominee for the Heart of FCE Award. Then the individual's efforts, projects and results or other contributions are written on the nomination form.

Next step is to send the application to the county/parish where a winner is selected, and that application is forwarded on to either an area/district for selection forwarding that winner to the state. The state then chooses a winner and sends all forms and a photo on to national.

National recognizes each state winner with a specially designed pin that cannot be purchased. Another pin design can be purchased by states to present to their winner.

So, you see they are a winner four times > club, county/parish, area/district, and state. WOW!

#### SPIRIT OF FCL

Barbara Perry, a Maryland FCE member was awarded the Spirit of FCL Award for 2018 at the National Conference held in Austin, Texas in July. Barbara attended the W. H. Kellogg Foundation FCL training in Chevy Chase, Maryland in 1989 or 1990. Following this training; she assisted Maryland in designing and hosting a two-day training program that was called "Who's in Charge?" Through the years she has participated in many leadership events which have given her a NAFCE Certified Trainer Badge.

Before 1979 there was no public library in Bethany Beach, DE. As years passed a mobile library visited the town, then a one room library opened several days a week. Time and dedication have now enhanced the town with a modern facility dedicated to community life and technology. Many volunteers provide talent and hours to maintain the high-quality facility and programs now provided daily. To help support the library, each summer there is a two-day cottage tour encompassing ten homes in the area... This involves over 500 volunteers to coordinate the event. Barbara has been a cottage coordinator for many years. Last year 1800 tickets were printed for the tour and over 2,000 were sold. Following expenses, the library received \$84,000.

Barbara states, "I had a challenge with a goal to meet. By friendly and sincere means I defined the methods to complete the task to those working on the team".

Barbara was truly deserving of this hallmark award of the FCL program where members of a community take control of their lives and help to change the world for the better by using the leadership skills that were learned through the Family Community Leadership program. We are blessed to have Barbara Perry as a part of our FCE Family.

We all know of other FCE members like Barbara who are deserving of this award. The award application can be found on the website so help them apply, encourage them to apply, or surprise them with an award at the 2019 Conference.

The Family Community Leadership program was started in 1981 by a grant awarded by the Kellogg Foundation. A day of FCL training is offered each year at the National FCE Conference. The educational materials presented at the confernce are available for purchase from National Headquarters.

#### NEWS FLASH RECEIVED FROM ACWW

Dear National Association for Family and Community Education,

I write on behalf of ACWW to thank you for the donation of \$2664.11, received on the 5th of February. This has been divided as specified, except that we have put your "Water for All" donations into the WE Fund: Sustainable Water, Sanitation and Energy. This fund covers projects which aim to improve access to water, water conservation and security, and access to sanitation facilities. I've done this because the water for all campaign ended in 2015, so this is the most appropriate place for your funds to go. Also, we cannot allocate donations towards a specific country (you specified a certain amount to go to India), so that \$734.09 has also gone in the WE Fund: Sustainable Water, Sanitation and Energy. The National FCE Board Alumni fundraiser at the 2019 Conference will be doing a silent auction of donated quilted items. This fundraiser is open to everyone that would like to donate a quilted item. It was a time to meet members from other states and hear what they are doing in their own states. For a first-time attendee, there was so much to learn. I learned about ACWW and hearing from the World President, Ruth Shanks, gave me a greater appreciation for our membership in such a worthy organization.

I found the FCL lessons and Hearth Fire series being educational and hope to teach them on the local and county levels.

#### ZERO HUNGER CHALLENGE

The Zero Hunger Challenge was launched by the Former United Nations General Secretary Ban Ki Moon in 2012; who envisioned a world where no person is hungry. ACWW signed up to the Zero Hunger Challenge in June 2015 and pledged to work to eliminate hunger in our lifetimes.

Our ACWW USAArea President, Jo Almond chose as her Campaign these past 3 years the Zero Hunger Challenge. She challenged everyone to take a small water bottle, small covered plastic container or sandwich size zippered Ziploc and fill it with dimes or soft money and bring the amount that had been saved to their state conference, or national conference. Half of these funds would be sent to ACWW and the other half to a feed the hungry program in your locality.

This challenge has been adopted by the National FCE and your State FCE organizations with half of the funds going to ACWW and the other half to a place that helps feed the hungry. If you were to fill a small water bottle with dimes it will hold \$47.00. If everyone were to do this, what a great amount this would be to share with ACWW and our community hungry programs.

So, check your pockets every day for any dimes or soft money to help bring Hunger to an end by filling a little water bottle, small container, or sandwich size Ziploc to the brim and bring it to the 2019 National Conference.

#### Scam phone calls JUST HANG UP!!

Phone calls claiming fraudulent usage of your social security number are not from the social security administration. **Hangup**.

If you get have caller id and get their phone number you can report the call to the social security office they have a form on their website that you can fill out.

Also the IRS does not call you asking for payment. Any one that demands you buy a gift card as payment is not legitimate. Do not pay hang up.
